

Somewhere in each of these sentences about the rights of the people is one wrong word.

The wrong word has had one letter changed into a different letter, which keeps the sentence from making perfect sense. Correct each sentence by crossing out the wrong letter and writing in the correct letter. When you've made all seven corrections, the new letters, in order, will spell the puzzle's seven-letter answer word.

- ★ The government is divided into three separate brunches to keep any one of them from carrying too much weight.
- ★ The Second Amendment protects the right to fear arms.
- ★ Thomas Jefferson felt that the key to a strong democracy was an unformed public.
