Also throughout the weeks, visitors can experience the *Growing Up, American Style Show* to find out what it was like to grow up in different eras of American history. Show highlights include a costume runway show featuring traditional-style dress from historical periods. Visitors will also learn how often kids bathed, what they did during the day, and what rights they had. The show will take place at 12:00 p.m. and 2:00 p.m., Mondays through Saturdays, and at 2:00 p.m. on Sundays.

Though kids today may find it hard to believe, children in the 1920s and 1930s listened to their favorite stories on the radio, rather than watching them on television. Visitors are invited to listen to popular old time radio shows at the *Growing Up, American Style Old Time Radio Listening Stations* from 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. in the Llewellyn Citizens' Café on the Grand Hall Overlook. Superman, Dick Tracy, The Lone Ranger, and other favorites will be featured.

Throughout the weeks, *Growing Up, American Style Guided Tours* will take visitors on a 30 minute tour of the National Constitution Center's permanent exhibition, *The Story of We the People*, to learn what it was like to be a child during each historical era. The tour features a personal guide who will direct visitors throughout the exhibit and explain the background and history of different time periods in U.S. history. Tours will begin at the Preamble Wall in the DeVos Exhibit Hall at 11:00 a.m., 1:00 p.m., and 3:00 p.m. daily except Sundays. There is a 40 person limit per tour.

Visitors can top off their experience by taking advantage of the *Growing Up, American Style Lunch with Your Doll* package for the duration of the two weeks. The Delegates' Restaurant will offer a special menu including, the Colonial Chicken Salad Sandwich, "Old Country" Meatballs and Spaghetti, a "Penny Pincher" Combo of Grilled Cheese and Tomato Soup, All-American Apple Pie, Victorian Tea Jelly Tarts, and more!

The National Constitution Center, located at 525 Arch St. on Philadelphia's Independence Mall, is an independent, nonpartisan, nonprofit organization dedicated to increasing public understanding of the U.S. Constitution and the ideas and values it represents. Opened on July 4, 2003, the Constitution Center is a museum, an education center, and a forum for debate on constitutional issues. The museum dramatically tells

the story of the Constitution from Revolutionary times to the present through more than 100 interactive, multimedia exhibits, film, photographs, text, sculpture and artifacts, and features a powerful, award-winning theatrical performance, "Freedom Rising". The Center also houses the Annenberg Center for Education and Outreach, which serves as the hub for national constitutional education. Also, serving as a nonpartisan forum for constitutional discourse, the Center presents – without endorsement – programs that contain diverse viewpoints on a broad range of issues. The Center is also the home of the Liberty Medal award, presented annually as a lasting legacy to the 200th anniversary of the Constitution.
