## ADD ONE/RICHARD STENGEL

Richard Stengel is the Managing Editor of *TIME* and the author of several books, including *January Sun*, *You're Too Kind*, and *Mandela's Way*. He also collaborated with Nelson Mandela on his autobiography, *Long Walk to Freedom*. Stengel worked on Bill Bradley's presidential campaign in 2000 as senior advisor and chief speechwriter, and was the co-moderator for the ServiceNation Presidential Candidates Forum in 2008. From 2004 to 2006, Stengel served as President and CEO of the National Constitution Center.

The Center also houses the Annenberg Center for Education and Outreach, which serves as the hub for national constitutional education.
