Kids can add their own patch to the museum’s Giant Thanksgiving Quilt all weekend from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. in the Grand Hall Overlook. Visitors can also learn ways to serve leftovers from Thanksgiving dinner during a cooking demonstration on Saturday, November 27 at 1 p.m. in the Delegates’ Restaurant. Max and Me Catering Company’s Executive Chef Shana Povlow will provide helpful hints and fresh ideas on what to do with turkey leftovers.

Kids can learn about how to exercise their rights and freedoms by watching the “Your Bill of Rights” show, located in the Richard and Helen DeVos permanent exhibit hall. Showtimes are every 30 minutes beginning at 10:15 a.m.

The National Constitution Center is open Sunday through Friday, 9:30 a.m. to 5 p.m., and Saturdays 9:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. Admission is \$7 for adults and \$5 for seniors ages 62 and up, children ages 4-12, and active military personnel.
