Visitors can try their hands at Colonial games, dress up in 18th Century fashions, and even "enlist" in the Continental Army.

Colonial Field Days will take place at the Center, July 9-11; 16-18; 23-25; and July 30-August 4, September 4-7, and October 1-4.

Flag Raising and Lowering Ceremony

9:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m.

Join the museum's staff each morning for a Flag Raising Ceremony, and then again in the evening as they reverently lower it.

Musters

11:00 a.m. and 12:00 p.m.

Become a recruit of the Continental Army. Supplied with wooden muskets, recruits will follow the lead of two soldiers who drill the participants in musket etiquette and marching orders of the Revolutionary Era.

Giant Flag Folding

Help the museum's staff fold a giant 20x30 foot American flag on the front lawn.
