# HIS HOLINESS THE DALAI LAMA TO ADDRESS NATIONAL CONSTITUTION CENTER LIBERTY MEDAL ATTENDEES VIA VIDEO RECORDING

### Ceremony to Also Include Remarks by Richard Gere and Video Tribute to His Holiness

Philadelphia, PA (October 22, 2015) – The National Constitution Center released additional details today about its 2015 Liberty Medal Ceremony taking place Monday, October 26, 2015, honoring **His Holiness the 14th Dalai Lama of Tibet**. Following a video greeting from former President George W. Bush, actor, activist, and philanthropist Richard Gere will speak about the Dalai Lama's achievements and introduce a video tribute to His Holiness. The tribute video will feature House Minority Leader Nancy Pelosi, Senator Diane Feinstein, and Indian film actress and singer Priyanka Chopra, among others.
