CELEBRATE VETERANS DAY AT THE NATIONAL CONSTITUTION CENTER WITH FREE ADMISSION SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 11, 2017

Philadelphia, PA (November 2, 2017) – On Veterans Day, Saturday, November 11, the National Constitution Center will recognize the dedication and sacrifices of the brave men and women who have answered the Constitution's call to "provide for the common defense" with free admission, courtesy of Macy's. Special events include a wreath laying ceremony, patriotic concert, chats with veterans, and engaging civic education programs. At activity stations, guests can make patriotic crafts, including star wreaths and poppy pins, and write thank you letters to American heroes who have served in our armed forces.

Free admission on Veterans Day includes access to the National Constitution Center's interactive main exhibit, the signature multimedia, theatrical performance of *Freedom Rising* presented in the Sidney Kimmel Theater, and the iconic *Signers' Hall*.

Visitors on Veterans Day will also have free access to the Center's feature exhibits, including *American Treasures: Documenting the Nation's Founding*, an intimate look at the rarest early drafts of the U.S. Constitution and the Bill of Rights; *John Marshall: Patriot, Statesman, Chief Justice*, which explores Marshall's character, constitutional legacy, and the influential roles he played in the early Republic; and *Constituting Liberty: From the Declaration to the Bill of Rights*, showcasing one of 12 original, surviving copies of the Bill of Rights.
