Guests can enjoy a pint or create refreshing ice cream floats using the molasses-based porter. Yards Brewmaster Steve Mashington will be on hand to discuss the brewing process. In homage to Washington's background as a whiskey distiller, specialty cocktails featuring Jack Daniel's new Tennessee Honey Whiskey also will be served.
