NATIONAL CONSTITUTION CENTER WELCOMES LESLEY ALBANESE AS VICE PRESIDENT OF DEVELOPMENT

Philadelphia, PA (March 24, 2014) – The National Constitution Center is pleased to announce the addition of **Lesley Albanese** as Vice President of Development after a six-month national search. Albanese joins the Constitution Center from the Cato Institute, a nonpartisan public policy research foundation in Washington, D.C., where she spent 17 years in various roles, most recently as Vice President of Development.

Albanese will oversee all fundraising efforts for the Constitution Center. She will focus on increasing annual support in all areas, including corporations, individuals, and foundations. Albanese also will continue to raise money for ongoing capital and endowment projects, including the museum's new Bill of Rights Gallery, which is scheduled for construction in late summer/early fall 2014, as well as the Constitution Center's annual Liberty Medal Awards Ceremony and Gala.

"Lesley's great depth and breadth of experience made her the perfect candidate for the job. She has proved masterful at cultivating donors from all sides of the political spectrum," said National Constitution Center President and CEO Jeffrey Rosen. "I am especially impressed by Lesley's passion for constitutional issues and her eagerness to promote the Constitution Center's unique national role as a forum for non-partisan constitutional education and debate."

In her role as Vice President of Development at the Cato Institute, Albanese was responsible for developing and directing the Institute's \$50 million "Liberating the Future" capital campaign, which expanded the Cato's headquarters on Massachusetts Avenue in D.C. Her experience includes stewardship, major gifts, development strategy, and special events.
