Typically held the last Sunday of each month, the Center's **Sensory-Friendly Days series** allows non-verbal learners and those who need to limit distractions to experience the Center in a secure and comfortable environment. Special programming and activities help visitors to connect with the Constitution and build their learning skills through movement, touch, and creative expression.



Young Citizens Scholarship Program

Through the Center's **Young Citizens Scholarship Program**, each year, thousands of students from Title 1 schools and underserved communities receive subsidized admission and travel to the Center, sparking curiosity and creating lasting memories through their visits.

The National Constitution Center is **approved as an Educational Improvement Organization (EIO)** and is **eligible to receive Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) funds** for the Young Citizens Scholarship Program from eligible organizations authorized to do business in Pennsylvania. THE CENTER AND THE DECADE OF CIVIC RENEWAL

Born out of the bicentennial of the Constitution in 1987, the National Constitution Center was chartered by Congress to disseminate nonpartisan information about the Constitution and has grown to be America's leading platform for civic education and civil dialogue for people of all ages and perspectives.

As the Center looks to the period between the nation's 250th in 2026 and the Constitution's 250th in 2037, we are focused on creating civic learning pathways designed to spark curiosity, deepen constitutional knowledge, and foster lifelong engagement with the Constitution and the responsibilities of self-government.

Through trusted scholarship, innovative civic learning resources, national convenings, new museum galleries, digital platforms, and intergenerational experiences, the Center is making constitutional learning more accessible, relevant, and joyful for learners of all ages. Priority initiatives include:

- **Expanded K-12 resources**, curriculum, and **teacher professional development programs**;
- National **Town Hall convenings, book clubs, and podcasts**;
- The development of **Constitution University**, a dynamic digital platform with courses for learners of all ages and AI-supported inquiry tools;
- New **intergenerational learning experiences** like our hands-on, play-based **Civic Quest**; and
- **Our Story Continues**, the Center's nationwide campaign inviting Americans to see themselves as part of an ongoing constitutional story.

Together, these efforts aim to strengthen civic culture, model rigorous and civil constitutional dialogue, and inspire a deeper sense of connection, responsibility, and stewardship for generations to come.
