#### ***Signers' Hall***

Sign the Constitution alongside 42 life-size, bronze statues of the Founding Fathers present at the signing on September 17, 1787.

#### ***American Treasures: Documenting the Nation's Founding***

Take an intimate look at the path the framers took to create the U.S. Constitution and secure the Bill of Rights.

#### ***Civil War and Reconstruction: The Battle for Freedom and Equality***

Explore the constitutional legacy of the 13th, 14th, and 15th Amendments, which transformed the Constitution—and America—by ending slavery and promising equal protection to all Americans.

#### ***The 19th Amendment: How Women Won the Vote***

Trace the triumphs and struggles that led to the ratification of the 19th Amendment, and will feature some of the many women who transformed constitutional history—including Elizabeth Cady Stanton, Alice Paul, and Ida B. Wells—and allows visitors to better understand the long fight for women's suffrage.

Featuring a rare copy of the U.S. Constitution, this gallery will tell the story of America's founding principles, exploring how we declared independence, fought a revolution, learned from early challenges, and ultimately developed a new form of government.

#### ***NEW! Separation of Powers Gallery***

##### **OPENING MAY 15, 2026**

This exhibit about the separation of powers will explore how the Constitution defines roles and balances power between the three branches of government and between the federal government and the states.
