Reaching NEW LEARNERS

The National Constitution Center is undertaking an ambitious 50-state strategy to reach America's K-12 students with our unique, proven approach to nonpartisan constitutional education. We're also working to provide teachers with the guidance and flexible classroom resources they need to instill habits of civil dialogue and reflection that will last a lifetime.

Constitution 101

The National Constitution Center's *Constitution 101* course provides learners with a basic understanding of the Constitution's text, history, structure, and caselaw. Participants study the historical and philosophical foundations of America's founding principles and learn how to think like constitutional scholars through primary source readings from a range of diverse voices, landmark Supreme Court cases, videos, enrichment and assessment activities, and more.

HIGH SCHOOL COURSE HIGHLIGHTS

The Center's high school *Constitution 101* course has reached **more than 5 million learners** since launching in September 2022, and 2 million in the 2023-2024 school year alone.

KHAN ACADEMY PARTNERSHIP



On Constitution Day 2024, the National Constitution Center and Khan Academy launched our *Constitution 101* student course on the Khan Academy platform. Featuring hundreds of videos drawn from **interviews with 46 leading constitutional experts** and dozens of exercises to reinforce learning through Khan's mastery system, the course offers a dynamic and engaging experience. **In the first six months post-launch, more than 30,000 learners spent more than 1.1 million minutes on the course.**

Coming Soon:

MIDDLE SCHOOL COURSE

Constitution Day 2025 will mark the launch of *Constitution 101* for middle school students, providing teachers with a blueprint for learning that addresses the unique educational needs of students in fifth through eighth grade. Each module will feature:

- a "Big Question" to frame the content
- · engaging videos and activities
- opportunities to practice vocabulary and connect primary sources with students' daily lives
- · assessments to measure growth in students' civic knowledge


Meet Lucy!

Our new animated narrator for the videos that accompany each *Constitution 101* middle school module will help students explore the Big Questions and see themselves as part of the American story.

We've been working with a select group of middle school educators from our Teacher Advisory Board and Teacher Advisory Council to develop the curriculum, and a cohort of 30 Constitutional Fellows and peer coaches to pilot modules and provide feedback prior to launch.

Educational Resources and Programming

The National Constitution Center offers a range of ways for students to engage with the Constitution, both in person and virtually. Across all our educational programming, we reached **4.3 million learners in the 2023-2024 school year.**



LIVE ONLINE CLASSES

Our online peer-to-peer Scholar Exchanges allow students to connect with other classrooms across the country as they practice civil dialogue on constitutional topics together. The 2023-2024 school year saw our highest levels of participation ever for the program, with more than 13,000 students representing more than 560 classrooms joining us.



CLASS TRIPS AND YOUNG CITIZENS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

More than 6,000 students visited the Center in 2024 as part of our Constitutional Ambassadors half-day workshops, an immersive learning experience that begins in the classroom and continues post-visit through our peer-to-peer Scholar Exchanges.

We were also pleased to welcome more than 5,000 students through our Young Citizens Scholarship Program, which subsidizes admission and travel for students who might not otherwise have the opportunity to visit the Center in person.

Coming Soon:

CIVIC TOOLKIT AND INTERACTIVE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE

This summer, the National Constitution Center will launch our America 250 Civic Toolkit, the essential guide to America's founding principles. The backbone of the toolkit will be a new *Interactive Declaration* of *Independence*, featuring annotations, essays, and historical context from an all-star lineup of scholars.

The toolkit will also feature videos, primary sources, interactives, and teacher and student-facing materials to reinforce learning and inspire discussion.

We'll be working with partners like **PBS** and **The Trust for the National Mall** to bring the toolkit and our other educational resources into classrooms and communities across America.

WORKSHOPS AND CONFERENCES

From monthly online professional learning sessions to multi-day institutes or weekend workshops, the National Constitution Center continues to offer a variety of opportunities for teachers to enhance civic and history instruction and constitutional understanding in their classrooms.

Our education team also connected with teachers at social studies conferences across the country, including North Carolina, Maryland, Virginia, Ohio, California, Wisconsin, and Washington, D.C., holding presentations and workshops, and answering attendees' questions about our resources.

TOWN HALLS

Our *America's Town Hall* programs featured more than 30 discussions with America's leading thinkers on constitutional topics ranging from key moments in history to the latest news developments, drawing audiences of up to 1,000 registrants per event.

Our honorary co-chair, retired Supreme Court **Justice Stephen G. Breyer**, joined us to share his perspective on interpreting the Constitution and the philosophy of the current Supreme Court's majority.

Tech policy experts **Mark Coeckelbergh**, **Mary Anne Franks**, and **Marc Rotenberg** examined the evolving relationship between artificial intelligence and constitutional principles, and strategies to protect democratic values in the digital age.

NATIVE PEOPLES AND REDEFINING U.S. HISTORY

Historians **Ned Blackhawk** and **Brenda Child** explored five centuries of U.S. history to shed light on the central role Indigenous peoples have played in shaping our nation's narrative.

CAN THE CONSTITUTION REVIVE THE AMERICAN DREAM?

Political analyst **Yuval Levin** and scholar **Aziz Rana** discussed the Constitution as America's religion and its role in fostering the American dream.

2024 ABC News Presidential Debate

On September 10, 2024, the National Constitution Center was the venue for the ABC News Presidential Debate between **Vice President Kamala Harris** and former **President Donald Trump**.

More than **67 million viewers across seven networks** tuned into the live debate, and round-the-clock coverage in the leadup to the event showcased the Center as a forum for public dialogue.

2024 First Amendment Summit

In partnership with **FIRE** and **NYU's First Amendment Watch**, the National Constitution Center convened America's leading thinkers for a vigorous discussion of the state of free speech in America and around the globe, including a keynote conversation about global free speech with **Jason Rezaian** of *The Washington Post*, followed by discussions of free speech on campus and in and out of the courts.

36th Annual Liberty Medal

The National Constitution Center closed out September by awarding the 36th Annual Liberty Medal to America's storyteller, renowned documentary filmmaker **Ken Burns**, for inspiring all of us to learn about the principles at the heart of the American idea. There's probably no more fitting venue for a political spectacle of this magnitude. In the two decades since the National Constitution Center opened its doors, it's proved to be much more than just a temple to one of our founding documents."

Transforming our education center


More than 150,000 visitors joined us in 2024 to explore our exhibits, view live performances like our award-winning Freedom Rising performance, and take part in community days at our headquarters. just steps from where the Declaration and Constitution were drafted and signed. We're working to greet the millions of visitors who will be journeying to America's birthplace for our country's 250th anniversary with new content and opportunities to engage with the story of our founding documents and ideals.



Coming Soon:

AMERICA'S FOUNDING AND SEPARATION OF POWERS GALLERIES

Our reenvisioning of our main exhibit, The Story of We the People, which began with the opening of our First Amendment gallery in 2023, is entering its next phase as we plan for new galleries on America's founding and the separation of powers, just in time to welcome visitors to Independence Mall in 2026.



AMERICA'S FOUNDING

Our America's founding gallery will trace the key moments leading to the Declaration of Independence and the American Revolution, America's shift from a loose alliance under the Articles of Confederation to a unified nation, the drafting and ratification of the Constitution, and the development of the Bill of Rights.

The gallery will feature a rare first edition of *The Federalist* and an original printing of the *Acts* of the *First Session* of the *First Congress* on permanent loan from **Judge J. Michael and Elizabeth A. Luttig**, and artifacts from **Independence National Historical Park**'s archaeological collection that were uncovered while the Center was under construction.

SEPARATION OF POWERS

The separation of powers gallery will explore each branch of the federal government—executive, legislative, and judicial—how they interact with each other through the system of checks and balances, and how the state and federal governments interact. The powers of each branch—and their expansion or limitations over time—will also be explored.

Community Events and Civic Holidays

SENSORY-FRIENDLY DAYS

2024 saw the return of our Sensory-Friendly Days series, which gives people of all abilities and their families the opportunity to experience the Center in a secure and comfortable environment. We also collaborated with community partners like **Art-Reach** and the **Philadelphia Ballet** to develop and provide special programming for visitors on these days.

MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. DAY

Visitors joined us for programming focused on King's legacy and vision of greater equality, including crafts, storytelling, a service project, a family concert, financial workshops, and a dramatic reading of King's "I Have a Dream" speech.

We explored the role of the executive branch and presidents throughout history with a special Kids Town Hall featuring presidential reenactors, a kids' costume contest, historic and contemporary voting booth demonstrations, and presidential trivia games.

September 17

Constitution Day

More than 14,000 people joined us in person and virtually for the country's biggest annual celebration commemorating the signing of the Constitution, featuring an array of special programs including:

- A Naturalization Ceremony, featuring a keynote address by MSNBC host and Center board member Ali Velshi, where 48 immigrants from 27 countries became new citizens.
- A conversation with Opal Lee, often described as "the grandmother of Juneteenth," on her role in establishing the holiday and the many ways we can share stories of the past.
- A Kids Town Hall featuring famous figures from throughout constitutional history.
- Civic Stories for students and an educator lunch with the National Constitution
 Center's honorary co-chair Supreme Court Justice Neil M. Gorsuch, followed
 by an evening America's Town Hall discussion of the justice's new book.
