Sheldon Gilbert is vice president for content and development at the National Constitution Center, providing strategic leadership for the content and distribution of the Center's events, programs, website, podcasts, blog, and other resources, as well as overseeing fundraising and communications. Gilbert also serves as a constitutional advisor to the Center, on a range of subjects in his capacity as senior fellow for constitutional studies.

A longtime constitutional litigator, Sheldon Gilbert has represented clients in nearly 100 cases at the U.S. Supreme Court. Gilbert has extensive experience in constitutional law and administrative law. He has been involved in some of the most significant Supreme Court cases of the last decade in these areas, such as *NLRB v. Noel Canning* and *UARG, et al. v. EPA*. He frequently speaks to the media and to audiences across the country on constitutional law and the history of the Supreme Court.

Before joining the National Constitution Center in 2018, Sheldon Gilbert served as the director of the Institute for Justice's Center for Judicial Engagement, where he educated the public about the role of the courts and the Constitution. Previously Gilbert was a litigator with the U.S. Chamber Litigation Center, representing the U.S. Chamber in over 400 cases in federal and state courts. He has also taught as a professorial lecturer at The George Washington University Law School.

Sheldon Gilbert graduated with honors from The George Washington University Law School, where he co-founded the national Religious Freedom Moot Court. He received his undergraduate degree in history from the University of Utah, where he was an avid policy and parliamentary debater. He is admitted to practice in the District of Columbia and before the U.S. Supreme Court, U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit, U.S. Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit, and the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs.

Sheldon Gilbert lives in the Philadelphia area with his wife and four children. In Sheldon's free time, he is an avid reader, artist, genealogical researcher, and pro bono litigator for veterans, widows, and others.
