FIRST SENIOR CLASS OF CONSTITUTION HIGH SCHOOL TO GRADUATE IN A CEREMONY AT THE NATIONAL CONSTITUTION CENTER

Philadelphia, PA (May 26, 2010) – Eighty-five students from the first senior class of Constitution High School will graduate at the National Constitution Center on Wednesday, June 16, 2010 at 6:30 p.m. The ceremony will include a keynote address by the First Lady of Pennsylvania, the Honorable Marjorie O. Rendell; remarks by Constitution High School Principal Dr. Thomas R. Davidson, Constitution High School President Todd Alexander Latimore-Handy, and National Constitution Center President and CEO David Eisner; and a performance by the Constitution High School Chorus.

Students that will be honored during the ceremony include class valedictorian Alfreda Davis from South Philadelphia and salutatorian Amy Taylor from Northeast Philadelphia, as well as students selected to receive "Awards of Excellence" for academic acheivement from Ballard Spahr Andrews and Ingersoll, LLP, and the Gilder Lehrman Institute of American History, and for active citizenship from the National Constitution Center. Students from the graduating class will continue their education at Alvernia University, Delaware State University, Drexel University, Fashion Institute for Design Merchandising, Gettysburg College, Millersville University, Pace University, Pennsylvania State University, Slippery Rock University, Spelman University, Temple University, Virginia Union University, West Chester University, and Widener University, among others.

Constitution High School launched in September 2006 in an effort to promote civic education and active citizenship. The history and civics themed Philadelphia School District magnet school was created in partnership with the National Constitution Center and the Gilder Lehrman Institute of American History, with additional support from Ballard Spahr Andrews & Ingersoll, LLP. It is the only Philadelphia School District high school with a Civics Education and American Studies theme.

The distinctive modes of student learning at Constitution High School include interdisciplinary studies, the use of primary historical documents, research writing, active civic engagement, problem solving (as it relates to societal issues), public presentations, and an exceptional role in school governance. Unique features for students include a yearly community service requirement; mentor relationships with Constitution Center staff; major historical field trips each year, including the opportunity to travel abroad; and utilization of the resources of the National Constitution Center, as well as other Philadelphia institutions, promoting student learning and engagement.
