"Freedom Rising" is an award-winning, state-of-the-art multi-media theater experience dedicated to connecting visitor—in a direct, engaging, and unforgettable way—with the story of the U.S. Constitution. This 345-seat theater-in-the-round production incorporates one actor, 360° projection, surprise scenic elements, theatrical-lighting, and a dynamic surround soundtrack. The production creates a magical environment in which visitors come to see themselves as a force in the life of the Constitution and the Constitution as an on-going force in all our lives in this country. "Freedom Rising" is performed every 30 minutes during museum hours, and is free with regular museum admission of \$9 for adults and \$7 for seniors ages 62 and up, children ages 4-12, and active military personnel. Children ages 3 and under are free.

The National Constitution Center, located at 525 Arch St. on Philadelphia's Independence Mall, is an independent, nonpartisan, nonprofit organization dedicated to increasing public understanding of the U.S. Constitution and the ideas and values it represents. Opened on July 4, 2003, the Constitution Center is a museum, an education center, and a forum for debate on constitutional issues. The museum dramatically tells the story of the Constitution from Revolutionary times to the present through more than 100 interactive, multimedia exhibits, film, photographs, text, sculpture and artifacts, and -MORE-
