Millions of voters will go to the polls in November's midterm elections, determining which party will control both chambers of Congress. All 435 House seats and 37 of 100 Senate seats are at stake.

Midterm elections, which occur in between elections for president, are often seen as a referendum on the sitting president's and incumbent party's performance. Since the 2006 election, Democrats have controlled both houses of Congress.



With the election of President Barack Obama in 2008, Democrats increased their majorities in both chambers.

This year Republicans hope to cut into Democratic majorities or gain control of the House and Senate. The choices voters make will determine how our government addresses issues that affect the lives of all Americans -- from jobs and the economy, to healthcare, to national security.
