NATIONAL CONSTITUTION CENTER'S PROHIBITION EXHIBITION TAPPED FOR *NEH ON THE ROAD*

Philadelphia, PA – NEH on the Road, a special initiative of the National Endowment for the Humanities, has sponsored a new 2,000 square foot adaptation of the National Constitution Center's world premiere exhibition, [American Spirits: The Rise and Fall of Prohibition](#), that will travel to 25 libraries, museums, universities, and other venues across the country over the course of the next five years. The exhibition, titled [Spirited: Prohibition in America](#), has been adapted for touring by the Mid-America Arts Alliance.

"We are honored that *American Spirits* was chosen as an NEH On the Road exhibition," said National Constitution Center Vice President of Exhibitions Stephanie Reyer. "NEH On the Road is a program that extends the life of exhibitions already funded by the Endowment by reducing them in size and circulating them among smaller community museums, libraries, and other non-profit venues. It is an extraordinary opportunity that will allow the same high-quality content and the Constitution Center's brand to reach every corner of the country."

American Spirits: The Rise and Fall of Prohibition, the largest and most extensive traveling exhibition the National Constitution Center has created, has traveled to St. Paul, MN and St. Louis, MO, since premiering at the Constitution Center in October 2012. It is currently booked to travel to museums in Missouri, Washington state, Michigan, and Indiana through 2016. NEH on the Road

NEH on the Road is an initiative of the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH), designed to create wider national access to the ideas, themes, and stories explored in major grant-funded NEH exhibitions. The program is funded by the NEH and run by Mid-America Arts Alliance. NEH on the Road exhibitions are adaptations of larger projects vetted and approved by the NEH. Each exhibition is designed to fit within 2,000 square feet and features approximately 40 actual objects as well as panels, banners, and other supporting materials. NEH on the Road allows for community organizations to create new connections to the humanities for their audiences. One of the requirements of participating in the program is that host venues will offer at least one humanities program in association with its exhibition hosting period. Successful applicants are eligible for a \$1,000 programming grant to help them with this project requirement. Learn more at nehontheroad.org.
